# CLASS DESCRIPTION

## FITTING AND SHOWING

- 1,2. Fitting & Showing: Judged 40% condition, grooming of horse, 10% appearance of exhibitor, cleanliness of tack and 50% showmanship Shown in hand at walk and trot.

## LEAD LINE CLASSES (Age 7 and under)

*Competitors must be led in the ring by a person 14 years or older; are eligible to enter Fitting and Showing, but are not eligible for any other class at this show. Competitors are placed, with ribbons for all.*

10. Lead-line Equitation: May be asked to trot/jog.
11. Lead-line Suitability: judged same as equitation, except with emphasis on suitability and manners of mount. Judge may ask to see evidence of control.

## WALK TROT/JOG DIVISION (Age 18 and under)

*No rider entered in these classes may compete in any class requiring entries to canter/lope.*

3. Walk Trot/Jog Equitation: to be shown at walk and trot/jog only. No rider entered may compete in any class requiring entries to canter/lope.
12. Walk Trot/Jog Pleasure ● Judged on manners and performance.
26. Walk Trot/Jog Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.

## SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION (Age 10 and under)

4. Short Stirrup Equitation: Walk, trot/jog and canter/lope.
13. Short Stirrup Pleasure ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance.
27. Short Stirrup Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.
33. Short Stirrup Equitation Over Fences: 4-6 fences 18", may trot or canter.

## JUNIOR DIVISION (Ages 11 to 14)

5. Junior Equitation: Walk, trot/jog and canter/lope.
14. Junior Pleasure ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance.
28. Junior Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.
35. Junior Equitation Over Fences: Fences not to exceed 2'0".

## SENIOR DIVISION (Ages 15 to 18)

6. Senior Equitation: Walk, trot/jog and canter/lope.
15. Senior Pleasure ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance.
29. Senior Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.
36. Senior Equitation Over Fences: Fences not to exceed 2'6".

## BEGINNER ADULT DIVISION (OVER 18)

*Riders entered in these classes may not compete in the other Adult Division classes.*

7. Beginner Adult Equitation: Walk trot/jog.
16. Beginner Adult Pleasure ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance.
30. Beginner Adult Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the pony or horse.
34. Beginner Adult Over Fences: Fences not to exceed 18".

## ADULT DIVISION (OVER 18)

8. Adult Equitation: Walk trot/jog and canter/lope.
17. Adult Pleasure ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance.
31. Adult Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.
37. Adult Equitation Over Fences: Fences not to exceed 2'6".

## PARENT FUN CLASSES

*Open to parents and friends of competitors  
Ribbons for all. Casual attire OK.*

9. Parent Equitation: Walk trot/jog. Canter optional but not mandatory.
18. Parent Pleasure: ● Ponies/horses judged on manners and performance. Canter optional but not mandatory.
32. Parent Trail ●● Judged on completion of each obstacle, with ease or difficulty and cooperation of the trail pony or horse.

## SPECIAL JUMPING CLASSES (Open to all ages)

*Classes will be timed. Top 10 clear rounds advance to jump-off.*

38. Stadium Jumper Classic: Fences not to exceed 2'6". A perpetual trophy will be presented.
39. Windrush Farm Jumper Classic: Fences not to exceed 2'9". Proceeds go to Windrush Farm Therapeutic Equitation Program. A perpetual trophy will be presented.
40. Lockwood Jumper Classic: Fences not to exceed 3'0". A perpetual trophy donated by Keith Angstadt will be presented.

## FUN CLASSES (Open to all ages)

- 19,20,21. Egg and Spoon: an elimination event. May walk trot/jog, canter/lope.
- 22,23. Command Class: An elimination event. To be shown at each gait as instructed, responding to each command immediately.
24. Break and Out: Pairs class. Will carry an 18" strip of paper. Elimination event.
25. Sit-A-Buck: an elimination event. To be ridden bareback. May walk trot/jog, canter/lope.

# BTA/BOLT Dressage and Horse Show

## Rules and Regulations 2009

1. Proof of negative Coggins test must be presented.
  2. All ages are as of January 1, 2009.
  3. No refunds without proof of injury to horse or rider.
  4. The show committee reserves the right to cancel or divide any class, therefore class order is subject to change.
  5. The 'IN' gate will close 2 minutes after the last call. The trail course and dressage ring (after 9:00 AM) are open for competitors in turn.
  6. The decision of the judge is FINAL.
  7. English and Western competitors are welcome to compete in the flat classes and Division awards.
  8. All riders must be neatly attired, including boots/shoes with heels and a ASTM certified helmet with chin strap. Western riders do not jump and are permitted to wear Western hats in the show and trail rings ONLY.
  9. For safety's sake, the show committee reserves the right to excuse any entry for showing unwarranted misbehavior or unsoundness.
  10. Remember good horsemanship: rest animals during breaks, loosen girth, offer water and protection from the sun/flyes. Mounts should be under control at all times.
  11. NO DOGS ALLOWED ON SHOW GROUNDS WITHOUT A LEASH.
  12. There shall be no working horses outside of designated warm-up areas.
  13. Horses or ponies prone to kicking should wear red ribbons in their tails.
  14. PLEASE, NO SMOKING on the Lockwood-Moore grounds.
- **Pleasure class** shall work on reasonable loose rein without loss of contact and exhibit a pleasurable ride.
  - **The trail course**, in a separate ring, will be open from 8:30AM to 1:00PM. Each competitor will please present him/herself to the gate as available. The course will have a time limit to be announced on show day. **Perpetual Trail Trophy** will be awarded to the top winner from all trail classes.
  - **Dressage riders** who are competing in **DRESSAGE ONLY** should pre-register and will be assigned times between 8:00 and 9:00 AM. Riders who are competing in other classes or who do not pre-register should report to warm-up day of show to arrange a convenient test time. All tests held in small arena. Ribbons in classes 41-44 awarded at end of show day. Any additional test of choice may be ridden on a schooling basis (no ribbons) as long as test scoring sheet is provided for judge.

## DIVISION SCORING

**Division Awards:** The six Division Champion and Reserve Champion awards will be scored as follows: Equitation and Pleasure classes are required. A third class, either a jump class or a trail class in your division must be completed. If both Trail and Jump are completed, the best standing will be used. Competitors who place in a division class and are not going for the final awards will be removed from the division standing scoring.

English, Saddleseat and Western riding styles compete together in the equitation, pleasure and trail classes. Jumping classes are for English style only.

There is a Championship Award and a Reserve Championship Award in each of the six divisions:

- Walk Trot/Jog
- Short Stirrup
- Junior
- Senior
- Beginner Adult
- Adult

**BTA Horsemanship/Sportsmanship Award:** Given in recognition of a rider under 18 years of age who shows outstanding horsemanship and sportsmanship. Judged on the following criteria: horsemanship, exhibitor's appearance, cleanliness of horse/pony and tack, sportsmanship, condition, care and treatment of the horse. A perpetual trophy donated by Mrs. Dunbar Lockwood will be presented.

**James T. Walsh Memorial Trophy:** Donated by Grandchildren: Mary Martin, Cathy Seale and Brenda Didlake. Best combined Trail and Pleasure Class placement all ages.

**Perpetual Trail Trophy:** Best score in trail class all ages.

**Jumper Classic Awards:** Perpetual trophies are given to winners of the three special jump classes -- the Stadium, Windrush, and Lockwood Jumper Classic. These classes will be timed and the top 10 clear rounds will advance to jump-off.
